## **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

This project will replace the existing Route 702 (Fontaine Avenue Extended) bridge over Morey Creek in Albemarle County.

The existing concrete slab bridge was built in 1932 and is considered structurally deficient.

VDOT proposes replacing the bridge with a box culvert.

During construction, Route 702 will be reduced to one lane controlled by temporary traffic signals on each end of the bridge.


Construction is expected to begin in fall 2022.

The Route 702 bridge carries approximately 1,700 vehicles per day.

Once construction is complete in summer 2023, the bridge will be open to all legal weight vehicles.

The design of this project is in compliance with the Stormwater Management Act, stormwater regulations and the annual stormwater management standards and specifications approved by the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation. The construction of this project will conform to the nationwide best management practices, VDOT specifications and special provisions, and the Virginia Department of Soil and Water conservation regulations.

During construction, every reasonable effort will be made to protect the environment with respect to dust and erosion control. Access to all properties will be maintained during construction.

#### **Environmental Review**

VDOT's Culpeper District Environmental office has performed environmental reviews and coordination to obtain information about environmental resources in the project vicinity; to provide natural and historic resource agencies an opportunity to review and comment on the project during its development; and to identify opportunities for avoidance, minimization and mitigation of potential environmental impacts.

This project is being coordinated through the State Environmental Review Process (SERP). Field surveys will be conducted and state resource agencies contacted to obtain input regarding the potential impacts of the project to the environment. SERP provides Virginia's environmental resource agencies an opportunity to comment on the highway improvements at the project initiation state.

The project will continue to be coordinated with the appropriate state and local agencies as part of environmental review and approval processes required throughout project development and construction. All required environmental clearances and permits will be obtained prior to commencement of construction. Strict compliance with all environmental conditions and commitments resulting from regulatory approvals and implementation of VDOT's specifications and standard best management practices will protect the environment during construction.

The property owners will be informed of the exact location of the easements during the right of way acquisition process and prior to construction.
